<u>Institute</u>: Humanities <u>DEPARTMENT</u>: Art

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course will provide students with an understanding of the theory and operation of computers as artists' tools. They will use paint software to create images. Students will need to dedicate additional time to working in the computer studio in order to complete assignments. (No previous computer experience is required. Some previous drawing experience is useful.)

Video Tutorials

Weekly video tutorials will be assigned for each unit. The assigned tutorials reside at http://lynda.com. Brookdale Community College pays a fee for this service. Students will need to have the login and password to access the tutorials. The login and password are posted in the computer studios.

Required Materials:

- 2- USB storage devices (one is used for backing up files). No excuses for lost, broken or corrupted files, back up all work.
- Three ring binder for handouts, notes
- Course assignments must be completed using the Photoshop software. A computer lab in the Center for the Visual Arts building has the software installed for your use. There are regularly scheduled assisted labs hours available.

Additional Time Requirements:

In addition to class time, students will need to dedicate approximately 3-5 hours per week to complete weekly assignments. This time will be essential to the successful completion of course objectives. A learning assistant will be available during regularly scheduled lab hours to work with students. (Refer to the lab schedule.)

Course Content:

Unit 1: Interface, Color & Files

- Students will become familiar with the Photoshop interface.
- Students will learn the basics of pixel management.
- Students will create and save documents.
- Students will learn the methods of navigating the workspace.
- Students will learn the toolbars keyboard shortcuts.
- Students will design, create and save a 16 color chart.
- Students will learn how to change the canvas size.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 2: Tools, Color, Brushes, Gradients

- Students will learn how to change pixel dimensions and resolution.
- Students will learn how to work with the brush tool and brush adjustments.
- Students will learn how to work with layers.
- Students will work with brushes, patterns and gradients.
- Students will complete the exercises dedicated to layers, color manipulation and gradients.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 3: Selecting, Patterns, More Brushes, Composting & History

- Students will learn how to create selections, work with and save selections.
- Students will learn to use the alignment features.
- Students will learn to use the history palette.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 4: Photo Colonization

- Students will use digital photos to color grayscale images.
- Students will use digital photos to create duo, tritone and quad tone images.
- •
- Students will scan and paint the animation scene.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.
- The Visual Story: First Draft

Unit 5: Landscape Painting

- Students will use their digital camera images to create shadow and highlight adjustments, to apply the lens blur filter, and use the replace color command.
- Students will create custom brushes to be used to paint the a landscape.
- Students will make repairs using the healing tool and the patch tool.
- Students will create a photo merge montage.
- Students will "rebuild" an image and explain the techniques in the weekly critique.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 6: Children's Book Cover

- Students will the text tool and images to create a children's book cover.
- Students will use the perspective feature to create a three dimensional open book.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 7: School Poster

- Students will incorporate their knowledge of fonts to create the text for a poster featuring a Brookdale activity.
- Students will create type, edit text, and create special effects with type.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 8: Pen Tool

- Students will create an image using the pen tool.
- Students should refer to the weekly handout for homework assignments.

Unit 9: Portfolio Presentation

- Students will present a slide show of Photoshop images to the class.
- Students will present their printed images.
