Course Code: RADT 267 **Title:** Advanced Imaging Procedures

Institute: Health Science Department: Radiologic Technology

Course Description: This course covers positioning terminology, anatomy, and procedure protocols for the skull and related anatomy, special procedures, including mammography, female imaging, bone density, and vascular imaging topics. Students will demonstrate skull and related procedures, as well as CT procedures and terminal (graduate) competency evaluations in the clinical setting.
