## Hartnell College Requirements for Associate Degrees (AA & AS)

## **Associate Degree General Education Requirements**

Students are eligible for graduation upon the satisfactory completion of the following requirements:

- Unit Requirement: A minimum of 60 degree-applicable semester units (courses numbered 1–199) must be completed.
- A minimum of 23 semester units must be completed across the following seven General Education areas:
  - 1. English Communication
    - a. English Composition (3 units)
    - b. Oral Communication & Critical Thinking (3 units)
  - Mathematical Concepts & Quantitative Reasoning (3 units)
  - 3. Arts & Humanities (3 units)
  - 4. Social & Behavioral Sciences (3 units)
  - 5. Physical & Biological Sciences (3 units)
  - 6. Ethnic Studies (3 units)
  - 7. Lifelong Understanding & Self Development (2 units)

- Residency Requirement: A minimum of 12 semester units must be completed in residence at Hartnell College.
- Major Requirements: Students must complete all required coursework for both General Education and a declared major. Each major consists of at least 18 semester units within a discipline or approved interdisciplinary program, as identified in the catalog.
- Minimum Grade Requirement: A grade of "C" or better is required in all degree-applicable courses, including those applied to the major and General Education.
- Graduation Petition: Students must file a Petition for Graduation by the published deadline, typically the semester before completing requirements. Graduation deadlines are posted throughout the campus and online.
- Degree Conferral and Commencement: Associate Degrees are conferred at the end of each academic term (Fall, Spring, Summer).
   Commencement ceremonies are held annually at the end of the Spring semester.

## **Definition of Associate Degrees**

Hartnell College awards both the **Associate of Arts (AA)** and the **Associate of Science (AS)** degrees to students who complete the appropriate requirements.

- Associate of Arts (AA):
  - Awarded to students majoring in disciplines such as the arts, humanities, and related fields.
- Associate of Science (AS):
  - Awarded to students majoring in areas such as agriculture, engineering, science, technology, and related programs.

Hartnell College also offers **Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADT)**; Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) and Associate in Science for Transfer (AS-T). These degrees are designed to create a clear and streamlined pathway to transfer to a CSU campus.

Please Note: Students pursuing an ADT must complete an approved Transfer General Education Pattern such as the CalGETC and not the local Hartnell GE pattern.

**Double Degree:** Students may concurrently complete the requirements for two or more associate degrees.

To qualify:

- Students must complete all Competency, General Education, and major requirements for each degree.
- A single diploma will be issued listing both degrees.
- General Studies with Emphasis degrees are not eligible for use in a double degree.

Additional Associate Degree: Students who have previously earned an associate degree from Hartnell College may pursue an additional associate degree by:

- Completing all requirements for the new degree program.
- General Studies with Emphasis degrees may not be earned as an additional degree.

Catalog Rights: Continuous attendance is defined as enrollment in at least one term during an academic year (Fall, Spring, Summer). A student who does not meet continuous attendance requirements during an academic year is considered to be a returning student and would follow the catalog requirements in effect at the time of their return. The academic year begins in the fall term. Students whose first semester of attendance is summer, would have catalog rights to the academic year immediately preceding the summer semester. Any academic record symbol such as (A through F, P, NP, CR, NC, I, IP, RD, EW, MW, W) shall constitute enrollment. See catalog for more information.
