## **EMPHASIS IN GLOBAL STUDIES: 2025-26**

Doctoral students must be enrolled in a Ph.D. program and in good standing in one the following departments: Anthropology, Communication, Comparative Literature, East Asian Languages and Cultural Studies, Education, English, Feminist Studies, Film and Media Studies, Geography, History, Linguistics, Music – Ethnomusicology, Political Science, Religious Studies, Sociology, and Theater and Dance. Candidates pursuing the Global Emphasis must also fulfill the departmental and University requirements related to their degree program.

Global Studies is the critical analysis of interactions, flows, institutions, trade and technologies that run across national boundaries or affect the world as a whole. The Department of Global Studies hosts an interdisciplinary Ph.D. Emphasis with a consortium of participating departments that allows students to design a course of study focused on transnational dynamics. Ph.D. Emphasis students may receive guidance and mentoring from Global Studies faculty as they prepare their dissertations, and the Global Emphasis is recognized when they are awarded the doctorate. The Emphasis is directed by Professor Jan Nederveen Pieterse in Global Studies (jnp@global.ucsb.edu) and supervised by a Coordinating Committee with members from each participating department. When applying to take part in the Global Studies Emphasis, students submit their C.V.
